Guests were entertained with Poetry of Robbie Burns presented by Moira Green accompanied by Garry Fancy on the violin; Songs of Robbie Burns beautifully sung by Margaret Anthony; the Highland Mist Pipe Band performing a number of Scottish tunes on the bag pipes; Dance demonstration of the Highland Fling and Sword Dances with a prelude on the history of the Scottish Dance presented by Heather Macdonald and Brenda Grant.






