## Our Last Three Bomber Command Veterans



April 10, 1925-September 2, 2015



Wally Kasper, Knight of the Legion of Honour, France April 12, 1921 - November19, 2015



George Bova, DFC, Knight of the Legion of Honour, France 1921 - 2015

With the passing of Comrade Wally Kasper late last year, Branch 638 has lost the last of its valiant WWII Bomber Command aircrew. The others who left us the same year were Bob McGee and George Bova.

Bob McGee was a navigator with No. 6 Group Squadron on Lancasters, and then 8 Group (Pathfinders) and completed a Tour of Operations. George Bova (Distinguished Flying Cross), volunteered for the R.C.A.F. on his 21st birthday and as a Wireless Operator/Air Gunner in Bomber Command completed TWO tours (60 missions), the second with 405 Pathfinder Squadron.

Wally Kasper served as a pilot with 408 Squadron, RCAF, completing a Tour of Operations and went on to fly Spitfires, Hurricanes, and post war, T-33 aircraft and F-86 Sabres. The fact that these three survived the hell of thirty operations in Bomber Command's is, in itself a minor miracle...six out of ten did not.

We younger and more fortunate ones can only imagine what these went through. Fortunately, the writings of Wally and others provide a fascinating history. The best record of their times rests with Murray Peden, a Canadian Bomber Command pilot who flew with the RAF, and recorded his memories in "A Thousand Shall Fall." An excerpt from this classic follows.

"To a person wanting to visualize how intense the strain could become, how suppressed fear could swell and gnaw inside, I offer the following as a comparison, perhaps easier to imagine than the unfamiliar surroundings of a darkened bomber cockpit framed in faintly luminous dials."

"Imagine yourself in a building of enormous size, pitch black inside. You are ordered to walk very slowly from one side to the other, then back. This walk in the dark will take you perhaps five or six hours. You know that in various nooks and crannies along your route killers armed with machine guns are lurking. They will

quickly become aware that you have started your journey, and will be trying to find you the whole course of the time you are on it. There is another rather important psychological factor: the continuous roar emanating from nearby machinery. It precludes the possibility of your getting any audible warning of danger's approach. You are thus aware that if the trouble you are expecting does come, it will burst upon you with the startling surprise one can experience standing in the shower and having someone abruptly jerk open the door of the steamy cubicle and shout over the noise. If the killers stalking you on your walk should happen to detect you, they will leap at you out of the darkness firing flaming tracers from their machine guns. Compared with the armament they are carrying, you are virtually defenceless. Moreover, you must carry a pail of gasoline and a shopping bag full of dynamite in one hand. If someone rushes at you and begins firing, about all you can do is fire a small calibre pistol in his direction and try to elude him in the dark. But these killers can run twice as fast as you, and if one stalks and catches you, the odds are he will wound and then incinerate you, or blow you into eternity. You are acutely aware of these possibilities for every second of the five or six hours you walk in the darkness, braced always, consciously or subconsciously, for a murderous burst of fire, and reminded of the stakes of the game periodically by the sight of guns flashing in the dark and great volcanic eruptions of flaming gasoline. You repeat this experience many times - if you live" (Murray Peden)

In those days, PTSD was unrecognized and unknown. LMF was the sobriquet for "Lack of Moral Fibre." Those who broke under the strain were unceremoniously drummed off the squadron in disgrace ... even though they were all volunteers!


