WARNING TO VETERANS RE EMAIL SCAM

Subject: Direct Deposit Veterans Affairs Canada

Below is an e-mail that was received by one of our members purportedly from Veteran Affairs Canada (VAC). Within it the member is requested to complete a form to switch their VAC payments to direct deposit. I have spoken with VAC, and they have confirmed that a request such as this would come in writing, not via e-mail, and as well, the form attached is not the proper format for this type of change.

I have forwarded this to VAC who are investigating, and should any of your members receive a similar email they should contact VAC directly.

A Rude Awakening

While serving on an examination vessel in the Bay of Fundy in 1944, we boarded a Russian ship to inspect its manifest and cargo. It had been at sea for six weeks, and when we approached the ship in a longboat, the crew of the Russian ship crowded the rails, looking down at us, and watching us come aboard. We were two young Canadian sailors and a young Lieutenant Examination officer. All three of us, still in our late teens.

All the way up the gangway, the Russian crew members were shouting, "comrade, comrade!"

We didn't realize, until we got aboard, that the whole ship's company were big, lusty-busty Russian women who had been at sea for at least six weeks and were extremely happy to see us healthy-looking young fellows.

Needless to say, it didn't take us too long to inspect the cargo and manifests and get out of there. Those women wanted more than a "hello" from us, and our examination officer was smart enough to order a hasty and dignified retreat to our own ship.

We later found out that the same Russian crew tried to gain access to a Merchant Seaman's Club, and when they were refused, because they were female, they proceeded to bust up the club. Some of them would have put King-Kong to shame. It took several weeks to put the club back into working order.
