



The Little Legion that Could

Back in September 1989, when fifty brave men and women applied for a chapter to start a branch of the Royal Canadian Legion in a Kanata, that was then a small suburb of Ottawa, there were a LOT of raised eyebrows. Many didn't think we could make it--and the 25 years that we have been in business have seen an abundance of problems, even very near brushes with financial disaster--but we weathered the storm.

We stand on the verge of paying off a crushing mortgage of almost \$800,000. We are financially in good shape, unlike many other branches. Our membership is remarkably stable, in a time when many branches our size have withered and died--though we will never cease welcoming new members.

How do we do it? Volunteers.

Throughout our 25 years we have relied on volunteers to carry out all of our operations, save the very few, like snow removal, that are beyond our ability. So many of our members have given so generously of their time and talents that it is impossible to name them all here.

Our successive service officers have helped a great many veterans to access government disability and other benefits.

One member has, for many years, operated (and called) all our weekly bingo games, which have given so much pleasure (and cash!) to Kanata's residents.

Another, for at least as long, has been our chef, purchasing officer, treasurer and Johnny-on-the-spot.

Yet another of our members has lovingly tended the Cenotaph and gardens since the inception of Kanata's own Cenotaph.

What makes us most proud to be Kanata's own Legion branch? It is what we have done to make our community a better place to live. Yes, we offer food and beverage services, a hall for public and private use, and host special events open to the public every year. Our Sunday afternoon bingo has been popular for many years, and we now have a reputation of offering some of the best fish and chips in Ottawa for lunch on Fridays.

For years we have operated a foot care clinic at a fraction of the cost of similar clinics in the west end, and we have hosted fundraisers for a wide variety of community organizations.

From our gaming revenues, we have poured more than a million dollars into more than fifty community organizations--minor sports, programs helping the disadvantaged and the handicapped, or that help the community--OUR community--in many different ways.

We have used the money YOU donate through the annual poppy campaigns to help many others. We support the four cadet corps active in our area. We hold public poster, poetry and public speaking competitions. We donate \$10, 000 in bursaries each year to Kanata students, and we support the Legion's province-wide bursary program.

We help to fund the Community Resource Centre's "Meals on Wheels" program. We buy medical equipment for the Queensway-Carleton Hospital.

We support local service agencies like the Ottawa Mission, The Shepherds of Good Hope, the Salvation Army, and very special places like Kanata's shelter for battered women and their children, and Kanata's hospice.

We assist the Military Families Resource Centre, and agencies that provide service dogs to veterans with post-traumatic stress disorder. We pour thousands of dollars each year into the care of damaged and indigent veterans: in Kanata, in Ontario, and in the former British West Indies colonies, (for whose aging veterans the Royal Canadian Legion is a major source of help).

Do you support the Kanata Food Cupboard? So do we.

Do you wear a poppy or give a thought to Remembrance Day? It was our branch that led the drive for a cenotaph in Kanata and it is our branch that organizes the annual services at that cenotaph.

Are you a member of the Kanata Seniors Centre? We were part of the force that pushed for its creation. Have you served in Afghanistan? Those hundreds of thousands of Tim Horton vouchers were all provided by the Legion and a small group of volunteers from our branch helped to process every one of them.

And it's all done with two things: your dollars and our volunteers. Together, we have done so much to build our community and we thank you.

Still think we're nothing but a watering hole for old drunks? Think again... and celebrate with us our 25th birthday as one of the more solvent branches in Ontario and--most important of all--we have made and continue to make a solid and lasting contribution to our community.



Congratulations Fish & Chip crews! We had another very successful month in August!

Speaking of fish... on the first Friday of September, we experienced some problems with the fish. For this I apologise. It wasn't the cook, it was the fish itself.

There is a shortage of halibut on the market, and it seems that this is part of the reason for a less than acceptable product. We contacted our supplier, who immediately picked up the rest of our stock. He was unable to replace it with a similar product, but did supply us with something that we think may be even better. The fish is still halibut, but a different cut. A test run on the second Friday of this month of the replacement product, proved to be successful. Therefore, we will continue to use the new product. It looks different, but tastes better!

On the subject of cooking, we are looking at having a City of Ottawa Health Department Food Handlers course here at our branch. Date is to be determined, but I think early in the new year would be better. We need a minimum of 10 people in order for the course to be held.

I strongly suggest that anyone who does food prep/cooking take the course. This includes members of the L.A., and those doing Bingo canteen as well.

The Health Inspector looks for this certification when doing an inspection. At present, only one person on duty in the kitchen out of the entire crew, is required to have certification. But let's be proactive and get this done before we are forced into it!
