Bicentenary of the War of 1812-14 (which accidentally ended in 1815!)

On June 12th, an important new temporary exhibition opened at the Canadian War Museum to mark the 200th anniversary of the declaration of war by the United States of America. The war saw action on land and sea over much of the eastern half of the continent, from the Midwestern states to Nova Scotia and from Newfoundland to Louisiana, as well as the north Atlantic, Caribbean, and even the Irish Sea. When it ended on Christmas Eve 1814, there were no real winners. The Americans had sent a total of eleven armies against what is now Canada, and Britain had retaliated in kind. None of them was successful, though both the capital of Upper Canada (York) and the US capital of Washington were both partially destroyed in the process. Due to the poor communications of the time, the last battle was fought near New Orleans some weeks AFTER peace had come.

There was a very clear loser – the Native peoples of Canada and the USA, whose rights and future were blithely tossed over the side during the last stages of peace negotiations at Ghent, in one of Britain's most shameful acts of betrayal of a loyal ally.

For the next few two years, you will be hearing a lot about the War of 1812,

If you'd like to learn more about this final war between the cousins, start by visiting the Canadian War Museum. If you'd like to read about it, your editor can give you quite a comprehensive list of books and audio books. If you REALLY want to get a feel for it, come to Bath Ontario on the final weekend of June where the largest War of 1812 re-enactment in Eastern Ontario will take place. Others will follow this summer at Gananoque, Plattsburgh NY (site of what Winston Churchill saw as the most important battle of the War) and Dunvegan in the heart of Glengarry County.

ENJOY COMMEMORATING YOUR PROUD HERITAGE and keep an eye out for the blinded seaman and his Moll (aka Harry & Sue).

"Yes, we need more bartenders; We need more bartenders TODAY!!!"


As the Legion does not survive on memberships alone, but predominantly on hall rentals and bar sales, we need YOUR help in staffing these functions.

The Poppy Trust Fund Committee administers the funds raised eah year through the annual poppy campaign. The range of things on which the Fund can be spent is quite limited and is strictly governed by articles 401-403 of the Poppy Manual,

Some of the things on which we spent money this year were:

- Veterans housing
- Student bursaries

- The Foot Care Clinic
- City homeless shelters
- Meals on Wheels
- Needy Caribbean veterans
- The Perley-Rideau veterns
- Comforts for veterans in long-term care
- Support to four cadet corps
- The Ottawa Mission
- The Shepherds of Good Hope
- Support to our District Service Officer, now Pat Royle
- Support to our Branch Service Offcer, now Moira Green.

The Fund also supports our own poppy campaign.

Don't you remember voting in favour of all these things at the general meeting on February 15? What? You say you weren't there?

We missed you.

The Branch also has a General Trust Fund, which is supported by money we make through our gaming operations – bingo, the sale of "Nevada" tickets and 50/50 draws. Each month, we have at least \$300 to distribute to other worthy community causes that cannot be funded from the Poppy Trust Fund.

Want to know what they are? Every expenditure from either fund must be approved by members at a general meeting. So come out for meetings and see what your funds are doing – or, better still, volunteer to serve on one of the committees and really get involved!
